Highlights for the 2017-18 year include:

Raising in excess of \$121K for our Rainforest Conservation Project

This has assisted our scientists to purchase a Differential Scanning Calorimeter which will greatly assist their vital works.

Volunteers again contributing close to 31,000 hours

Our volunteers have worked tirelessly for the benefit of Foundation & Friends, in the office, catering, becoming event and exhibition team members, staffing information booths and joining our

plant sales teams. These contributions are priceless.

Artisans in the Gardens & Botanica: Symbiosis

Artisans just continued on its path to being our standout event, with sales reaching record levels and setting the bar high for next year.

OUR VOLUNTEERS

During the 2017-18 financial year we were supported by 342 outstanding volunteers who generously donated almost 31,000 volunteer hours.

OUR EXHIBITIONS, EVENTS AND TOURS

This year's ambitious program of almost 100 exhibitions and events enticed more than 15,000 visitors to the Gardens.

Highlights included *Artisans in the Gardens'* outstanding 11% increase in sales over the previous financial year and enrolments of almost 4,800 participants in Foundation and Friends' diverse program of talks, workshops, classes, walks and day trips.

OUR DONATIONS AT WORK

Foundation & Friends plays a critical role in supporting your three Gardens. More than 50% of the Gardens' funds are self-generated, with donations from our supporters ensuring that vital horticultural, scientific, education and conservation work continues. During 2017 -18, Foundation & Friends raised and donated funds to more than 20 high-priority projects across all three Gardens. Our key appeal raised funds for the Rainforest Conservation Project and we were thrilled to surpass our target.

Rainforest Conservation Project Raised \$121K

This vital project will help protect our precious rainforests. Funds raised will be used to purchase a Differential Scanning Calorimeter machine which will enable our scientists to:

- fast-track research
- bank more species
- position themselves as leaders in rainforest conservation research in the South Pacific region.

Six Staff Scholarships Committed \$30K

Foundation & Friends committed funds for six diverse scholarships for Gardens' staff to further their knowledge in their respective areas of specialty.

These scholarships included:

- travelling to the US to study best practice in trial bed horticulture
- travelling to Western Australia to study carnivorous plants.

Southern African Garden Bed Paid \$10K

Almost \$10K was provided for the acquisition of four critically endangered Encephalartos (cycad) species for the Southern African Garden Bed at the Royal Botanic Garden Sydney.

Through our contribution it is hoped that the Royal Botanic Garden will establish breeding populations of these four very rare plant species.
